Dear Judge Gritton.

I have completed the review of the Anderson County EMS (ACEMS) as previously agreed via my letter dated January 27, 2025. The following are my general observations and recommendations.

I found widespread discontent and discord among the employees at ACEMS. Executive management was often adverse to the rank and file and executive management and was often adverse to each other. There has been consistent inconsistency in the manner in which rules/policies are addressed and employees are generally frustrated and unhappy. Executive management has often treated employees in a demeaning manner and has repeatedly used offensive language in addressing employees. There is little to no respect shown between management and employees and there has been a growing rift amongst employees. Employees have a widespread perception of unfairness and have expressed feeling intimidated and unheard.

Compounding the dysfunctional management are low salaries, the need for improved training and very poor living conditions. Many employees stated they could overlook the low salaries since they are primarily motivated by helping others. However, the EMS facility is in disrepair and is in need of major repairs and improvements. Additionally, the current arrangement at the facility results in male and females sleeping in the same room, which is not an acceptable practice in 2025. The employees at ACEMS unquestionably deserve better living conditions.

Based on the data I have received and other research I have conducted I have the following recommendations:

- 1. Consideration should be given to replacing the ACEMS management team. Should new management be installed, they should be given the ultimate discretion on making any necessary adjustments.
- 2. The current philosophy/practice is to have EMS assimilated with a Fire Service whenever practical. This usually results in economies of scale and a more efficient operation.
- 3. It appears the ideal configuration for EMS is to have a Director and each shift staffed by 3 Paramedics, 3 EMTs and one chase vehicle staffed by a Paramedic. This arrangement should be implemented on a trial basis and reassessed after 6 months. It is possible the chase vehicle may not be essential.
- 4. Focus should be directed and funds should be earmarked to making significant improvements to the EMS facility.
- 5. New management should review the practice of hiring employees in a part-time status, working them more than full time and not contributing to the Kentucky Pension System. This practice may result in a liability for the county and the employee.
- 6. New management should consider devising a vigorous, hands on training program for all EMS employees.
- 7. Serious consideration should be given to raising EMS reimbursement rates.
- 8. New management should consider having EMS engage in transports from Frankfort Regional Medical Center, in order to increase revenue.

In conclusion, I found the ACEMS was predominantly staffed with well-intended employees who want to make a difference in the community but need the support and resources to do so. I trust this information is helpful to Anderson County and look forward to an improved ACEMS.



ORDINANCE # 2025-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANDERSON COUNTY CODE, ORDINANCE NUMBER 2007-01

WHEREAS, The Anderson County Fiscal Court desires to amend the Anderson County Code, Ordinance 2007-01 – "Chapter 111: Alcoholic Beverages" in order to promote further economic growth, development, and tourism within the county by making specific provisions relating to the licensing for manufacture, distribution and sale of alcoholic beverages and for the collection of regulatory fees related thereto in a manner which is consistent with the provisions established in the Kentucky Revised Statutes now in effect and as may be hereafter amended by the Kentucky General Assembly.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT, COUNTY OF ANDERSON, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY, THAT THE ANDERSON COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, ORDINANCE #2007-01 IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE

(A.) **CHAPTER 111: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES – §111.11 is**, pursuant to §10.17 of the Anderson County Code of Ordinances, hereby **REPEALED**.

SECTION TWO

(A.) CHAPTER 111: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES – §111.11 is, pursuant to §10.17 of the Anderson County Code of Ordinances, hereby REVISED, AMENDED, and ENACTED AS FOLLOWS:

§ 111.11 HOURS OF OPERATION; SUNDAY SALES.

(A) Pursuant to KRS 244.290 and KRS 244.480, licensees are permitted to sell any alcoholic beverage between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight, Monday through Saturday. Further, licensees are permitted to sell any alcoholic beverage between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, unless specifically authorized to do so by this section.

- (B) No licensee authorized under § 111.06 may sell any alcoholic beverage at any time when the licensee does not have food available for sale.
- (C) Restaurants, hotels and motels which have obtained all appropriate licenses and which are in compliance with all applicable statutory regulations governing the sale of alcoholic beverages by such entities, including the procurement of a local Sunday sales license, may sell such alcoholic beverages as they are otherwise licensed to sell, on Sunday between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m., under such other conditions and restrictions as apply.
- (D) A licensee operating a restaurant under a quota retail drink license (QD), may obtain a Sunday sales licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. but may operate thereunder only if such licensee receives from its total food and beverage sales at least fifty percent (50%) of its gross receipts from the sale of food as reported to the local ABC Administrator on the "Monthly ABC Regulatory Report NQ-2 Retail Drink Quota Retail Drink (Restaurant)" form.
- (E) A licensee operating under a limited golf course license may obtain a Sunday sales license and may operate thereunder on Sunday between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.
- (F) In years that December 31 falls on a Sunday notwithstanding the restrictions otherwise set forth in this section, licensees are permitted to sell any alcoholic beverage, as they are otherwise licensed to sell, between the hours of 11:00 a.m. on December 31, New Year's Eve, until 1:30 a.m. on January 1, New Year's Day.
