AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE AMENDMENT OF THE ANDERSON COUNTY ZONING MAP ORDINANCE NO. 2025-4

Be it ordained by the Anderson Fiscal Court, Commonwealth of Kentucky:

SECTION I

The Anderson Fiscal Court has considered the record before the Lawrenceburg/Anderson County, Kentucky Joint Planning Commission in its Docket No. 25-002 including the record of the public hearing held by the Planning Commission on July 22, 2025 and the actions and recommendation of the Planning Commission and its staff as set out in the minutes of its July 22, 2025 meeting. The Anderson Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons and findings of the Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Commission in this matter as set out in its minutes.

SECTION II

More specifically, the Anderson Fiscal Court concurs in the findings of the Planning Commission and adopts said findings as its own to wit:

The request for rezoning is in agreement with the Comprehensive Plan, goals eleven (11) and thirteen (13). This is intended to create a diverse mix of affordable housing and will support a stable economic base.

SECTION III

Therefore, the Zoning Map of Anderson County, Kentucky is hereby amended as it affects the property described here in from A-1 (Agricultural District) to R-2 (Two-Family Residential District). The property so rezoned, being the same property of Randy Keith Chrisman Revocable Trust as described in Deed Book 283 Page 354 and Plat Cabinet A Slide 55, said property being located approximately 0.47 miles north from Ninevah Road and Buckley Lane, in Anderson County, Kentucky, which is more particularly described as follows.

Beginning at an iron pin in the right of way Buckley Lane (Plat Cabinet A Slide 55), said iron pin being corner to Darlene Cook (Deed Book 145, Page 298). Thence leaving the right of way of Buckley Lane and with the line of Darlene Cook

Judge Gritton and Members of Fiscal Court,

On behalf of the Anderson Public Library, I submit this year's tax rate information for Fiscal Year 2025–2026:

Real Property: 6.5¢ per \$100
Personal Property: 6.5¢ per \$100

Motor Vehicle & Watercraft: 2.7¢ per \$100

These revenues are vital to maintaining and expanding services that directly benefit Anderson County residents.

Impact of Library Services in FY 2024-2025

- Circulation: 84,298 books borrowed by patrons.
- Outreach: 1,933 items delivered to homebound titizens.
- Programs: Over 2,000 programs offered for all ages.
- Digital Access: More than 3,000 patrons utilized our eResources.
- Technology Use: 11,503 sessions on public computers and Wi-Fi.
- Library Visits: Over 56,600 in-person visits (averaging 4,000 each month).
- Membership Growth: 12,241 active cardholders, with 80–90 new cards issued monthly.
- Community Savings: Patrons saved an estimated \$1,386,081 by using library services instead of purchasing materials and services privately.

Putting It in Perspective

With Anderson County's population at approximately 24,000, more than half of our residents hold an active library card. On average, every resident benefitted from at least \$58 worth of services per person in the past year. This demonstrates that the library provides a strong return on investment for local taxpayers, ensuring that every tax dollar is multiplied into educational, cultural, and technological value for the community.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANDERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AMENDING THE FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE #2025-5

WHEREAS, the Anderson County Fiscal Court in Anderson County, Kentucky had previous established a Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance within the Anderson County, and

WHEREAS, all ordinances and part of ordinances in conflict herewith, to the extent of such conflict only, are hereby repealed, and

WHEREAS, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, re-adoption, and publication as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Anderson County, Anderson County Fiscal Court that the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance for the Anderson County be amended as follows:

ARTICLE 2 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

<u>Substantial Improvement</u> - Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, taking place during a 5-year period in which the cumulative percentage of improvements equals or exceeds fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the "start of construction" of the improvement. This term includes structures which have incurred "substantial damage", regardless of the actual repair work performed. The term does not, however, include either:

- a.) Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of state or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local Code Enforcement Official and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions, or
- b.) Any alteration of a "historic structure" provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure."

Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.



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
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

SITE CHARACTERISTICS/PURPOSE

The owner is requesting a zone change from I-1 (Light Industry) to A-1 (Agricultural District) for 4.81 acres of the subject property which contains 6.00 acres total and located on Glensboro Road Lawrenceburg, Kentucky. The site has access to public water, and electricity. The owner proposes to re-zone the property back to its original zoning, A-1 Agriculture.

West Zoned I-1 Distillery

STAFF REVIEW/FINDINGS:

The property is one parcel of land on the south side of Glensboro Road and adjacent to Hammond Creek. The proposal is to Consolidate the zoning for property which is currently split zoned. 4.81 acres of a 6.0 acre property was zoned I-1.


The subject property is 6.0 acres with one house on it. A portion of the parcel was re-zoned to I-1 at some point in time prior to 1978, leaving the house and 1.19 acres zoned A-1.

The property was never developed or used for Industrial purposes.

The applicant states that - "The property was bought in 1978 and was zoned Industrial at that time. The property was used as a rural/agricultural homesite since 1978 and is not appropriate for Industrial use."

The property is a rural residence and is surrounded by other rural homesites. The one exception is the distillery, Old Commonwealth, to the west of the subject property.

The property is not adjacent to the City and is not within the Urban Service Boundary (USB) district. Glensboro Road is a two-lane state route, and is suitable for the current uses, but is not planned for any upgrades or improvements.





STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends APPROVAL with the following findings for this request,

1. The request is in agreement with the Comprehensive Plan, Goal 1 and Objective 1.1, listed below.

Logistics and Land Use:

GOAL 1: Determine and place agricultural, public, residential, commercial, and industrial uses in their rightful and compatible locations.

OBJECTIVE 1.1: Encourage industrial facilities to locate on sites with adequate transportation capacity.

-END OF TRC REPORT-

Came to speak William and Rita Whitnel, 1143 Blackberry Drive, Lawrenceburg, KY, who asked that their realtor represent them in these proceedings.

Came to speak Josh Webb, realtor representing the Whitnels, stating the property under consideration for a zone change has been on the market for an extended period of time. This is, in large part, because the property is split into two (2) separate zones; those being I-1 (Light Industry) and A-1 (Agricultural). The issue created is that banks will not write a home mortgage for property zoned as industrial. Although the zoning has not changed since the Whitnels purchased this land, banking policies have changed. Therefore, it is necessary to request that the portion of the property currently zoned as I-1 be rezoned to conform with the remainder of the tract.

Commissioner Thomas inquired as to the acreage being addressed.

Mr. Webb advised the total tract is six (6) acres; consisting of approximately 4.81 acres zoned I-1 and approximately 1.1 zoned A-1.

Commissioner Bird sought to clarify that the zoning on the property has been 'split' for the duration of the Whitnels' ownership. Which would imply that the zoning has always been incorrect and would, therefore, meet the criteria for consideration to be rezoned.

Mr. Webb stated that Commissioner Bird is correct in his assessment of the history of the property.

Attorney Ed Logan asked if the property in question is surrounded by agricultural land?

Mr. Webb responded in the affirmative. Including the fact that it is only the area on the western side of the property that abuts with other property zoned Industrial.

Attorney Logan asked if the dwelling falls within the A-1 (Agricultural) zoning district or if it lies in the I-1 (Light Industrial) zoning district? And if there are any other buildings that lie on the Industrial zoning area?

Mr. Webb responded that the home sits on the parcel currently zoned A-1 (Agricultural). He explained there is one barn, circa 1850's, that is also located on the Agricultural portion of the land.

Mr. and Ms. Whitnel both confirmed Mr. Webb's statements.

Attorney Logan then asked of the prospective buyers why were they seeking this rezoning? Was the incentive to be approved for the loan?

Two (2) individuals in the audience responded to Mr. Logan in the affirmative.

Commissioner Nearhoff offered that his livelihood for thirty-four (34) years had been earned as a loan officer for a bank. He further stated it is correct that a home mortgage would not be approved on property zoned as industrial.

Vice Chair Hughes stated that he will always lean toward agricultural zoning.

Madam Chair Webb asked for comments in favor or opposition. There came no one to speak.

There being no further discussion, motion was made by Jody Hughes, seconded by David Bird, to recommend the zone change to A-1 (Agricultural).

Motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Whitnel asked what steps would be required in the future?

Attorney Logan advised that the motion, having been passed by the Joint Planning Commission, would now be recommended to the County Fiscal Court. The zone change will now pass through their (the Fiscal Court's) proceedings.

OTHER BUSINESS

Letters of Credit - Parkview Business Center:

Ms. Lile advised the Commission that a new letter of credit has been received for RAM Parkview Business Center, and has been extended for twelve (12) months.
