

Fiscal Court Department Head Report December 5, 2023

Jason attended the Grand Jury hearing for the 2023 General Election on November 21st. There were no findings of irregularities.

The office is already preparing for the 2024 Primary Election. We need at least 20 more Election Officers to work on Election Day. Anyone interested in becoming an election officer can contact their respective party representatives, or they can call Jason or Bonnie at the office.

In preparation for the transition from our current statewide motor vehicle system, AVIS, to the new system, KAVIS, our office will be open on Friday, December 29th even though it is a county holiday. New Years will be observed the following Monday and Tuesday, January 1st and 2nd. During the transition, approximately 350 million records have to be migrated over to the new system. For this reason, our Motor Vehicle Department will be closed to the public from January 3nd until January 10th, but deputies will still be in the office working behind the scenes. The Motor Vehicle deputies will be out of the office on Wednesday, January 3nd, because they will be in the office working on Saturday, January 6th to ensure that the KAVIS system will be operational by the 10th. Some counties across the state will not be open to the public until the 16th. This transition to KAVIS has been in the works for approximately ten years, and we are advertising the closure as much as possible to ensure the public is prepared.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY TRANSPORTATION CABINET DEPARTMENT OF RURAL AND MUNICIPAL AID AND AND ANDERSON COUNTY

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Rural and Municipal Aid, hereinafter referred to as the "Department" and the ANDERSON COUNTY Fiscal Court, hereinafter referred to as the "County."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, it would be to the benefit of the traveling public to perform bituminous resurfacing with hot mix asphalt on Puncheon Creek Road (CR 1107), which shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Project"; and WHEREAS, the County has expressed its desire to perform the work for the aforementioned Project and to be responsible for all phases of the Project;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- The Department shall be responsible for providing Rural Secondary funding in an amount not to exceed \$168,856 for the reimbursement of the abovementioned Project.
- 2. If the Project is performed by Contract, the County shall employ only contractors prequalified by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for the work items included in the Project and shall comply with all legal bidding requirements including, but not limited to, the provisions of KRS 45A and 424. Concurrence must be obtained by the County through the District 7 Chief District Engineer in Lexington, KY, prior to the awarding of any contract for work or materials to be used on this Project.
- 3. The County shall cause the Project to be constructed to a level which meets applicable county road and bridge standards (all bridges will be required to meet or exceed an H-20 loading); approval from Bridge Preservation Branch of Division of Maintenance MUST BE OBTAINED before ANY additional load is added to any

inventoried structure. Furthermore, all materials paid for by the Department used on, or incorporated into,

the Project shall meet the requirements specified in the Highway Department's Specifications for Road and

permits or approval of plans for work to be accomplished on state-owned right-of-way from the Cabinet's

District 7 Office in Lexington, KY. The County hereby agrees to put forth a reasonable effort to do

maintenance on roads listed herein prior to bitummous surface being applied. Maintenance being defined but

not limited to proper ditching, cleaning or replacement of clogged or deficient drain tiles, proper shouldering,

surface preparation, and any other obvious maintenance the road may need. In accordance with, Kentucky

further agrees that placement of a culvert or road tile shall be required for any new entrance constructed

law. The minimum thickness of any bituminous surface applied shall be one inch.

4. The County shall indemnify and hold harmless the Department and all of its officers, agents, and employees
